Just to start, see just everyday people with snow on their skin. They see a joy in a good laugh and a snowfall just as much as the rest of us.



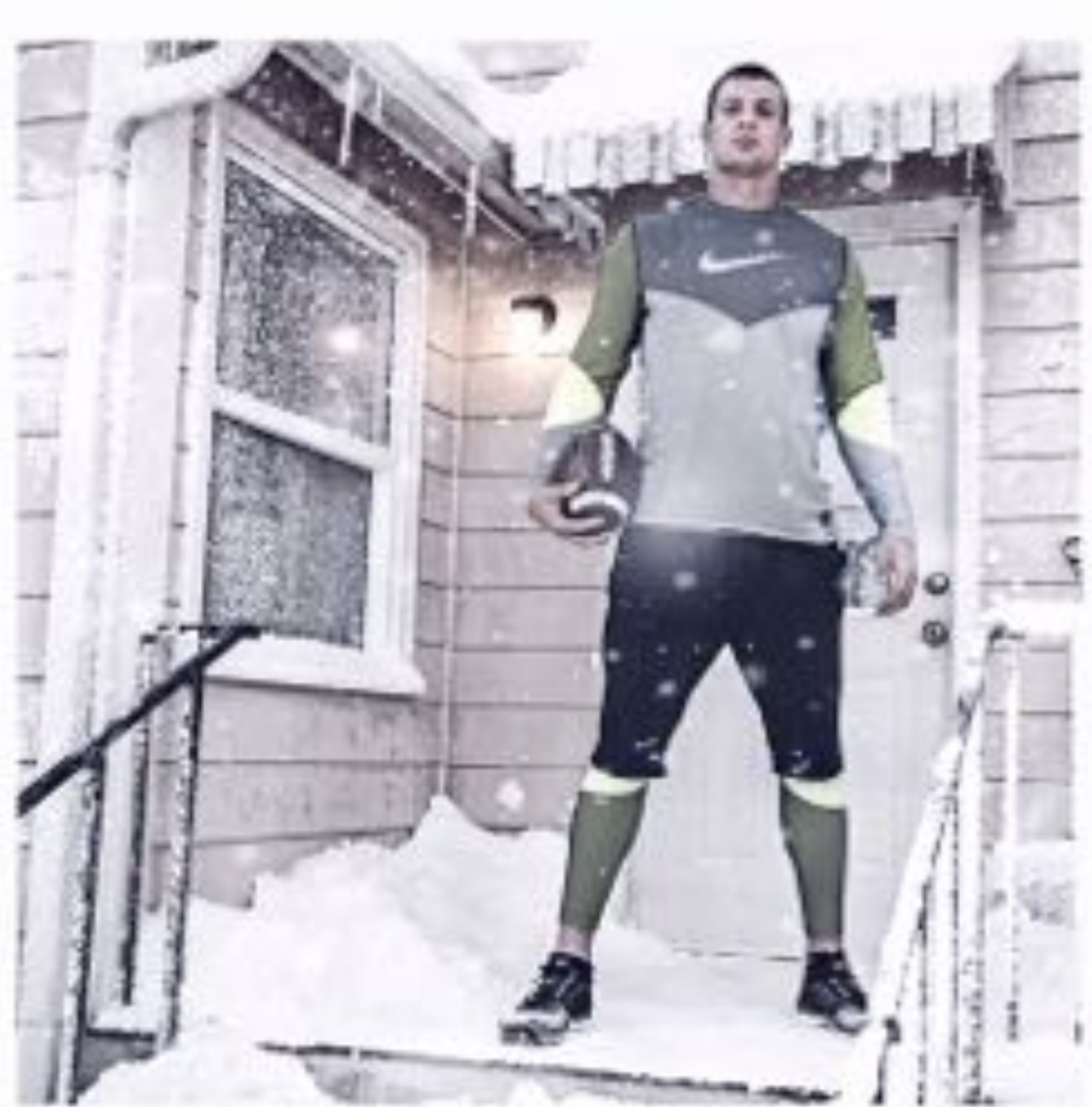
